Greetings WAG supporters!


2019 was the "Year of the Healthy Pet" at WAG, as we expanded our wellness clinic by increasing the number of appointments and services! In February, we welcomed a new veterinarian, Dr. Katie Gray, who got right to work adding services such as heartworm testing and prevention medicines, senior blood panels, cat tapeworm treatments and dog Parvo/Distemper and Bordetella (kennel cough) vaccines. Additionally, we began selling many prescriptions without an appointment for patients up-to-date on their yearly WAG exams (always free with services for animals already spayed/neutered.)

Meanwhile, Dr. Robe and his surgical team have worked hard to keep WAG on track to exceed 5,000 spay/neuter surgeries again this year, bringing us close to our 60,000 surgery milestone—conservatively representing 300,000 fewer unwanted cats and dogs suffering on our streets or taxing our community's shelters and rescues.

We are looking forward to our 12th year of service in 2020, helping empty the shelters one spay/neuter surgery at a time. So whether you order a new WAG S/N license plate (see p. 4 for details!), make a monthly donation or year-end contribution, volunteer, round up your bill at checkout or drop a donation in our Spay It Forward jar, we cannot thank you enough! Remember, together we can FIX pet overpopulation!

What if you could style your ride, show your support for S/N and pet pride, all while raising funds for WAG and other Oregon S/N services? Well, now you can!

Introducing WAG's "Oregon Loves Its Pets" license plate, available for preorder. For just \$40, purchasers will receive a voucher redeemable for WAG's plate. Once we've sold 3,000 vouchers, plate production will begin. Voucher purchases can be made at WAG's clinic or at wagwag.org. What a great holiday gift idea!

WAG receives all funds generated by voucher sales, less costs, once plates become available. Vouchers can then be redeemed at DMV for the plates. The faster we sell the vouchers, the sooner plates will become available, so please help us spread the word! Each plate sold will translate into two low-income subsidies!

Low plate numbers 00001-00020 will be made available by WAG auction to voucher purchasers once the plates go into production, raising additional revenue for S/N subsidies. Stay tuned for more info!

WAG VET HELPS CHEETAHS!

An African S/N Vacation

WAG's very own Dr. Robe and his wife, Diane Hawley, made their third trip to Namibia in 2019 to volunteer at the Cheetah Conservation Fund (CCF). CCF is an international model for wildlife conservation which works "with all stakeholders to develop best practices in research, education and land use to benefit all species, including people."





They assisted staff veterinarians with whatever they needed, including surgery on a resident cheetah taken illegally as a cub and hand-raised (making her non-releasable). In spite of a contraceptive implant, she showed interest in males and was scheduled to be spayed. Dr. Robe assisted when the vet was unable to locate her uterus and confirmed the cheetah was previously spayed.

While Dr. Robe and Diane definitely earned their keep (actually, they paid CCF!), they had an amazing experience and look forward to their next trip assisting with a new S/N program for dogs in Namibia.
